Bank Holiday on Monday 19th September – Funeral of Queen Elizabeth II

It was announced over the weekend that Monday 19th September has been declared a Bank Holiday to mark the funeral of Queen Elizabeth II. I can confirm that our schools will be closed on that day.

Over the next week, the staff will continue to talk to the children, answering any questions they might have and taking time to explain to them what will happen during this period of National Mourning. We will continue to mark the passing of Queen Elizabeth and the succession of King Charles III in appropriate ways.

Her Majesty sacrificed much for our country and served with unwavering dedication and that will not be forgotten.

In the true spirit of Her Majesty, these parties, concerts and picnics brought people from different communities, backgrounds and ages together for a very special weekend of celebrations. Lots of local people also took part in the formal celebrations in central London. These are special memories that will be cherished.

I know that many people will have their own personal memories which they will reflect on, and the Council will be opening books of condolence for those who wish to pay their respects locally. These will be available from tomorrow afternoon at The Civic Suite, Catford; Downham Library and the Deptford Lounge.



The flag at the Civic Suite is being flown at half-mast as a mark of respect and our thoughts and sympathies are with the Royal Family at this sad and difficult time.

Primary School Admissions for 2023

Is your child due to start primary school in September 2023?

If your child was born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019, you can apply for a Reception place for September 2023.

Before you apply you should:

- Research your local primary schools
- Visit schools you want to apply for
- Carefully check the criteria for schools you are interested in.



Lewisham website has all the important information you need to know about applying for primary school places. The information is intended for residents of the Lewisham borough only. If your child lives outside the borough, you are welcome to apply for schools in Lewisham but must do so through your local council.

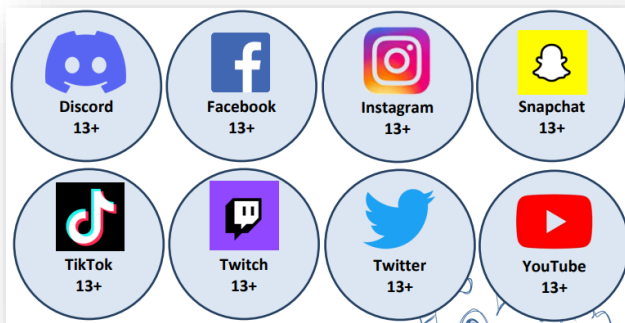
Reporting functions

If your child is using any of the below apps then make sure you show them how to use the reporting facilities within each app and ensure your child knows that they must tell you or another trusted adult if they see anything upsetting online. Use the apps together and explore the different security and privacy settings.

Rights Respecting at Brindishe Schools - Article of the Week

Article 38 (war and armed conflicts)

Governments must not allow children under the age of 15 to take part in war or join the armed forces. Governments must do everything they can to protect and care for children affected by war and armed conflict.

Article 39 (recovery from trauma and reintegration)

Children who have experienced neglect, abuse, exploitation, torture or who are victims of war must receive special support to help them recover their health, dignity, self-respect and social life.

This week's articles are linked with International Day of Peace, observed around the world each year on 21st September. Children at Brindishe use existing strategies such as mindfulness and calming techniques to ensure their learning environments are peaceful.

Take five minutes to sit peacefully, be still and quiet... to consider all that you could do for yourself.

How does it feel to be at peace with yourself, and in your community?

Being at peace within yourself is important. What one thing could you do to bring greater peace into your own life?

Polio Booster for 1-9 year olds

Children aged 1 to 9 years old in London are being offered a dose of polio vaccine. For some children this may be an extra dose on top of their routine vaccinations. In other children it may bring them up to date with their routine vaccinations. There are signs the virus may be spreading in London and the number of children vaccinated in London is lower than it should be. Boosting immunity in children should help protect them and reduce the risk of the virus continuing to spread in Lewisham and beyond.

Lewisham Hospital is offering children the polio vaccine. Polio can be very serious, and the vaccine will boost children's protection.
