The children will also have an opportunity to ask questions.

DT Week - A Celebration of Creativity and Innovation

Most of our children will be completing their DT learning for the term next week. This is always an exciting time, as pupils across the school showcase their creativity, problem-solving skills, and practical abilities through hands-on projects. The units for Spring term are as follows:

- Year 1 Textiles: Bookmarks Developing fine motor skills and an introduction to stitching.
- Year 2 Mechanisms: Vehicles Exploring simple mechanics and designing a moving vehicle.
- Year 3 Textiles: Wall Hangings Learning about patterns, textures, and fabric techniques.
- Year 4 Textiles: Money Containers *(Completed earlier this term)*
- Year 5 Mechanisms: Moving Toys Investigating how cams and levers create movement.
- Year 6 Using Electricity to Make a Model Move A more advanced project focusing on circuits and controlled movement, (to be completed after half term).

DT is a vital subject that fosters creativity, resilience, and real-world problem-solving, and we can't wait to see the incredible work our children will produce.

Top Tips for for Parents and Carers of 3-7 year olds

Safer Internet Day 2025 will take place on the 11th of February 2025, with celebrations and learning based around the theme 'Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online'.

Each year we cover an online issue or theme that speaks about the things young people are seeing and experiencing online. This year Safer Internet Day will be focusing on the issue of scams online and for young people, how to protect themselves and others, as well as what support is available to them. We will lead assemblies for the children and computing lessons will include these themes next week!

Our older children will be looking at;

- How is changing technology like generative AI going to impact the approach of scammers?
- What role can the government and internet industry take to tackle this threat?
- And what changes would young people like to see to help protect themselves moving forward?
